



1. All enrollment forms must be completed and on file before a child can participate in camp.
2. Children who are ill are not to remain in camp. If the child becomes ill during the day, parents will be called and the child should be picked up.
3. If your child is to take any medication, including aspirin, you will need to fill out a medication form giving us permission to administer that medication. This is a state regulation.
4. Children should wear washable clothing in which they will be comfortable. Modest clothing is requested. Halter tops, short shorts, and clothing of this type should not be worn to camp. Footwear should be only tennis shoes and socks (jellies or sandals are not appropriate for most camp activities).
5. Snacks are provided every afternoon. Breakfast & lunch is also provided each day. If your child has any food allergies you must inform the child's group leader in writing.
6. Children are accepted in the camp who will profit from experiences in this setting. If it is determined that the child will not profit from this service, other arrangements must be made.
7. Adequate materials and supplies are provided, so children will not need to bring toys or games with them unless asked to do so by their group leader.
8. Children will not need money during the day, so we request that they not bring any with them to the camp unless requested by the director for a special treat. The only exception will be for any special field trips that may be taken to the County Fair, Buffalo Farm, etc.
9. Children will be participating in water activities most days and are requested to bring a labeled bag with their swimsuit/change of clothes, towel, and flip-flops (labeled). Cutoffs or shorts and shirts would be better than swimming suits. Absolutely NO two-piece swim suits will be permitted.
10. A security system is provided for the safety of your child. Please follow our system for the Delivery and Retrieval of your child.
11. Any exceptions to the above policies must be cleared through ARTIE CARNES, Executive Director of the camp. The telephone number to reach him is (812) 821-3037.
12. Although we take every precaution, according to the State of Indiana, anyone who rides a horse accepts all liability for doing so. If you do not want your child to ride horses please indicate so in writing. If you want your child to wear a helmet while riding you must provide it for your child.
